1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance (Chris Dzadovsky, Chair)

Mr. Dzadovsky called the meeting to order at 9:39 a.m. and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Election of Officers (Glen Torcivia, Legal Counsel)

Mr. Torcivia explained the tradition of the Vice Chair replacing the Chair along with the Secretary moving to the Vice Chair position.

Requested Action: Elect Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary for Calendar Year 2024.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY DOUG BOURNIQUE TO ELECT JEFF BROWER AS CHAIR FOR 2024. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY ROB FELTNER. MOTION PASSED. LIBBY PIGMAN ABSENT. A MOTION WAS MADE BY CHRIS DZADOVSKY TO ELECT JOE EARMAN AS VICE CHAIR AND STACEY HETHERINGTON AS SECRETARY FOR 2024. MOTION SECONDED BY ROB FELTNER. MOTION PASSED. LIBBY PIGMAN WAS ABSENT.

3. Introduction of IRL Council Board of Directors and Special Guests (Jeff Brower, Chair)

Mr. Brower thanked Mr. Dzadovsky for serving the IRL Council with distinction and presented a custom gavel mounted to a mangrove root. Mr. Dzadovsky thanked all for the opportunity to work with the Board and the staff and looked forward to continuing this work.

The board members introduced themselves.

Mr. Brower acknowledged Jennifer DiMaio and Becky Allenbach from the DEP for watching the live-streaming meeting. Dr. Mark Rains from FDEP was also welcomed and invited to speak. Dr. Rains thanked all the members for their work in the Indian River Lagoon and all Florida NEPs. He briefly overviewed the funds appropriated to the IRL and expressed his belief that the funds would continue under the current governor and legislature. Dr. Rains encouraged the group to choose the best projects that would provide the biggest benefit in building a solid foundation.

4. Agenda Revisions (Jeff Brower, Chair)

THERE WERE NO AGENDA REVISIONS. A MOTION WAS MADE BY CHRIS DZADOVSKY TO ACCEPT THE AGENDA. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY ROB FELTNER. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

5. Resolutions, Recognition, Letters and Awards (Jeff Brower, Chair)

Chair Brower acknowledged Chris Dzadovsky.

6. Public Comment

Patty Barlow, St. Lucie Conservation Alliance, spoke on the three dredging permit applications on the Riverwatch Conservation Easement. Three permit applications are in progress to alter the easement. Ms. Barlow asked to protect this conservation easement.

Richard Carl Silvestri, St. Lucie Conservation Alliance, supported the protection of the Riverwatch Easement.

Terry McGinn spoke on the subject of a proposed hotel development on the shore of the lagoon in Sebastian. Prevention of damage to the water of the lagoon has a greater benefit than remediation if the hotel is allowed to be built.

Mike Sole discussed the additional nutrient load to the Indian River Lagoon that would be caused by the hotel development and urged the board to focus on solving the water quality issue.

7. Water Quality Reports

a. Northern and Central IRL Lagoon (Lauren Hall)

Ms. Hall reported that the data collection is from the continuous monitoring sondes in the north and central lagoon areas. The water depth throughout is showing a gradual decline, which is typical for this season. Salinity remains in the brackish ranges for all stations: dips are due to rainfall events. Temperature drops coincide with cold fronts but rise quickly. Chlorophyll remains under 10 RFU with the exception of Eau Gallie. Spikes of *pseudo-nitzschia* have occurred, but nothing significant currently. Turbidity peaks occur due to wind conditions and rainfall events. Fluorescent dissolved organic matter (FDOM) at Eau Gallie River and Vero are trending upwards due to freshwater tributaries' proximity. December and January experienced an unusual rainfall event with over seven cumulative inches. Reviewing the same timeframe for a similar amount, it was noted that 2016 was a strong El Nino year; going further back to the same amount, 2010 was a moderate El Nino year.

b. Southern IRL Lagoon (Dr. Melanie Parker)

Dr. Parker reports the freshwater flow has big spikes due to rainfall events, with the largest amounts from the Tidal Basin; no Lake Okeechobee discharges since April 2023. The salinity at the HR1 site fell into the damaging range at the surface and the stress range at the bottom. The US1 Bridge salinity decreased to the stress level at the surface and optimum level at the bottom. A1A Bridge remained at the optimal level at both the surface and bottom. This week the salinity has increased at all sites.

The juvenile oyster (spat) recruitment rates showed a small peak from August through October; it is typical to see lower recruitment rates late in the year when water temperatures cool.

8. IRLNEP Management Conference Committee Reports

a. Management Board Report (Bob Musser, past Vice Chair)

Mr. Musser reported that there were 25 members and 10 guests in attendance. Beth Powell, from Indian River County Parks and Recreation, was elected as the chair, while Terry Breeden from Brevard County Natural Resources Management was elected as the Vice Chair. The committee approved the revised MOA with Brevard Zoo and also approved the ranking and funding, including additional funding for three of the four categories of RFPs. Additionally, the FY 2025 budget and the FY 2024 amended budget were approved, along with the FY 2025 EPA work plan and the RFQ request, including the sole source for the SDS accounting. Lastly, the presentation from Dr. Holly Sweat of the Smithsonian Marine Station was well-received and informative.

b. STEM Advisory Committee (Dr. Chuck Jacoby)

Dr. Jacoby reported that he and Chad Truxall were elected as Chair and Vice Chair. The committee recommended the approval of the consent agenda items: the MOA, the FY 2024 Amended Budget, the FY 2025 Tentative Budget, and the FY 2025 EPA Work Plan. Also recommended approving the ranked proposals and adding additional funding. The committee experienced *The Indian River Lagoon Species Inventory: 30 Years of Cataloging Biodiversity*; Dr. Jacoby encouraged all to view the website.

c. Citizens' Advisory Committee (Kathy Hill)

Ms. Hill reported on behalf of Frank Catino. All actionable agenda items were approved. This included the additional funding for three of the four RFPs. A robust conversation was had to combat the notion that "no one is doing anything to fix the lagoon." Many attainable solutions were brought forward.

10. Old Business

IRL Council funding partnership with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the University of South Florida. (Duane De Freese)

Dr. De Freese clarified that the IRL Council and FDEP have agreed to contract with the University of South Florida to ensure that the IRL Council remains involved and fully aligned with the Governor's intent for the IRL Conservation Program and the water quality issues ongoing in the IRL. Funding will provide three months of salary to USF faculty to collect and analyze data and modeling information about IRL water and habitat quality, resilience, and emerging issues. This work will inform FDEP's statewide focus on water quality and the IRLNEP's focus on the IRL, CCMP revision, and the health of the IRL.

Requested Actions: Authorize staff to enter into a 3-year agreement with USF to work cooperatively with FDEP and USF to coordinate and align grant activities associated with the IRL Protection Program (F.S. 373.469) and the IRLNEP Comprehensive Conservation and Management Plan (CCMP).

A MOTION WAS MADE BY ROB FELTNER TO AUTHORIZE STAFF TO ENTER INTO A 3-YEAR AGREEMENT WITH USF TO WORK COOPERATIVELY WITH FDEP AND USF TO COORDINATE AND ALIGN GRANT ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE IRL PROTECTION PROGRAM (F.S. 373.469) AND THE IRLNEP COMPREHENSIVE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT PLAN (CCMP). THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY DOUG BOURNIQUE. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

11. New Business

a. Fiscal Year 2025 Water Quality RFP (Daniel Kolodny)

Mr. Kolodny announced the top two proposals statistically tied. Both projects will be funded. The surplus funding for the Water Quality category will be offered to the third-ranked project; this will not match the requested amount for that project.

b. Fiscal Year 2025 Habitat Restoration RFP (Daniel Kolodny)

Mr. Kolodny announced the top two proposals, also statistically tied in the Habitat Restoration category. Staff recommends applying \$17,840 of the Fund Balance to fully fund both tied top proposals.

1. Accept the IRLNEP Management Conference recommendations and approve the final ranked list of FY 2025 Habitat Restoration proposals.

MOTION WAS SECONDED BY AARON WATKINS. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

c. Fiscal Year 2025 Community-Based Restoration RFP (Daniel Kolodny)

Mr. Kolodny announced that funding will cover the top two proposals, with the third-ranked proposal having partial funding. Staff recommends applying \$11,974 of the Fund Balance to fully fund the third project. The second, third and fourth projects scoring in the Community-Based Habitat Restoration category scored within one point of each other.

Mr. Joe Earman asked the Board to consider funding the fourth-ranked proposal, stating the project will yield immediate results and that the organization, Coastal Connections Inc., has the expertise to be successful. It was also noted that the scoring separation between the fourth-ranked and the third-ranked project was one-quarter of one point. The question was posed to Mr. Kolodny if funding was available, and the response was affirmative.

d. Fiscal Year 2025 Science and Innovation RFP (Daniel Kolodny)

Mr. Kolodny announced the top three ranked proposals could be fully funded, with the fourth proposal receiving partial funding. The staff recommends applying \$2,212 of the Fund Balance to fund project #4 fully.

Mr. Kolodny explained the entries on the tentative budget. A correction was made to the text for 1c. Science and Innovation is an error; the correction is Community-Based.

Requested Action: Review and adopt the tentative budget for FY 2025 by Resolution 2024-01, pursuant to Florida Statutes.

f. Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Amendment (Daniel Kolodny)

Mr. Kolodny explained the changes in the FY 2024 budget: reduced facility expenses, and increased salary and benefits.

Requested Action: Review and amend the final budget for FY 2024 by Resolution 2024-02, pursuant to Florida Statutes.

g. Fiscal Year 2025 EPA Workplan (Daniel Kolodny)

Requested Action: Authorize staff to develop and submit the FY 2025 EPA Workplan by June 1, 2024.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY ROB FELTNER TO AUTHORIZE STAFF TO DEVELOP AND SUBMIT THE FY 2025 EPA WORKPLAN BY JUNE 1, 2024. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY AARON WATKINS. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

h. New Request for Qualification (RFQ) solicitations for Accounting Services and Printing Services (Duane De Freese)

Dr. De Freese discussed the difficulty of soliciting printing service bids and ensuring high-quality services. The accounting contract with Special District Services is nearing its end, but the SDS staff understands the intricate IRLNEP's restricted funds well. SDS played a crucial role in securing a higher interest rate, and the IRLNEP staff strongly believes renewing the contract would benefit.

Requested Action: Authorize staff to develop and release RFQs for identified services, identify the most qualified contractor(s), and provide staff commendations to the Board.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY ROB FELTNER TO AUTHORIZE STAFF TO DEVELOP AND RELEASE AN RFQ FOR PRINTING. IDENTIFY THE MOST QUALIFIED CONTRACTORS(S) AND PROVIDE STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY DOUG BOURNIQUE. MOTION WAS PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY CHRIS DZADOVSKY TO RENEW THE CONTRACT WITH SPECIAL DISTRICT SERVICES FOR ACCOUNTING SERVICES. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY ROB FELTNER. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

12. IRLNEP Staff Reports:

a. Community Engagement Update (Kathy Hill)

Ms. Hill reported the social media metrics and comparison between the engagement rates of the two quarters. During the holidays, the engagement rate decreased, and it was observed that reels perform better than static photos. The majority of the audience continues to trend to be women. The CEC metrics included attendance at eight local government meetings and twenty-six events. The team conducted eleven presentations, participated in twenty community meetings, and braved the cooler temperatures while participating in nine fieldwork and project opportunities. Forty-one outreach occasions were facilitated. Ms. Hill invited the members to visit the office to collect a logo polo shirt and tour the recently acquired second-floor space.

b. Information Technology and Data Science Update (KJ Ayres-Guerra)

Ms. Ayres-Guerra reported the Master Project Map had been posted on the One Lagoon website; it includes all projects from Fiscal Year 2016 through Fiscal Year 2023. The map is interactive and contains project information, photos, and a final report from each project. Comments have been collected, and an improved iteration of MPM 2.0 is planned for 2024. Ms. Ayres-Guerra announced projects for 2024 include a digital web application of the Boaters Guide created by FWC and MRC, not to be used as a navigation tool, updating the website, developing a Lagoon History Story Map and publishing lagoon-wide datasets and requested available geospatial data to be submitted. A question was asked if pump-out stations will be included in the digital Boaters Guide. This can be incorporated.

c. IRL Project Update (Daniel Kolodny)

Mr. Kolodny announced the first quarter was busy, with five completed projects and forty-five in progress. Mr. Kolodny was happy to report one of the oldest projects, the North Sebastian Phase 2 Septic to Sewer, has been completed. Mr. Kolodny gave an overview of three other completed projects; one completed small grant project was reviewed. Dr. Duane De Freese thanked the volunteers who provided the reviews and scoring of the RFPs and thanked Dan Kolodny for the quick turnaround on the proposal work, from ranking the scored projects to completing the 2025 tentative budget in the last few weeks.

d. Executive Director Report (Duane De Freese)

Dr. De Freese reported that the IRLNEP has partnered with the Southeast and Caribbean Disaster Resilience Partnership (SCDRP) to develop a NOAA Climate Resilience Regional Challenge grant proposal, to be submitted on Tuesday. One focus is on the priority community of Morris Creek in Ft. Pierce. No information on the other NOAA proposal had been received. Dr. De Freese discussed attending a meeting at the Kennedy Space Center and thanked NASA and MINWR for the field trip and tour. In addition, participation in the Southeast Coastal Ocean Observing Regional Association (SECOORA) board meeting and in the SCDRP meeting, where he now holds the chair position, was discussed. The legislative action exemption language for meeting attendance electronically is still alive. Dr. De Freese thanked the Florida legislature members and staff for their work and efforts on this item. He requested all invitations for himself or staff for presentations to be brought forward.

Requested Action: No motion is required. Information only.

13. IRL Council Member Reports

Libby Pigman, SFWMD, announced the celebration of the EAA STA completion. The ongoing monitoring of Lake Okeechobee levels are concerning, and they expect discharges into the St. Lucie Estuary, starting before oyster spawning season. Open house meetings were conducted for the Headwaters area, where updates were given on restorations, regulations and the beginning of the process of addressing northern storage.

Aaron Watkins, FDEP, re-emphasized Dr. Mark Rains' comments on historical funding and support from the governor's office and legislature for water quality improvement projects. Twenty-one projects have been identified. Mr. Watkins commended Dr. Rains for his work on water throughout the state. FDEP proposes Senate Bill 1386 and HB 1557 to formalize the programs to protect the Florida environment, coral reefs, and aquatic preserves, improve reclaimed water, and strengthen reliance. Mr. Watkins commended the FDEP leadership in Tallahassee for the work accomplished.

Rob Feltner, Brevard County, recognized Virginia Barker, Natural Resources Director, in the audience. Brevard County completed leaky sewer lateral repairs, quick connect to sewer, septic upgrades, expansion completed at south central sewer area, derelict vessels removed, baffle boxes completed, UCF conducted surveys of aquatic plants and oyster beds, received FDEP grant, many projects completed, planned, or in the design process.

Chris Dzadovsky reported on the North Beach area septic to sewer project; one community chose not to give easements into the community, the only community on North Beach not connected to sewer. Mr. Dzadovsky invited Caleta Scott to come forward and report on the presentation on emerging wastewater technology at the North Beach wastewater treatment plant. Interest in a demonstration at the landfill on leachate water.

Joe Earman, Indian River County, recognized Melissa Meisenburg, the Senior Lagoon Environmental Specialist, in the audience. Indian River County has removed derelict vessels, soon to start septic to sewer projects, announced Indian River County's Environmental Lands Acquisition Panel is accepting nominations for land parcels for acquisition for conservation; Heather Stapleton sits on the Panel.

Jeff Brower, Volusia County, welcomed Jennifer Spain, the Water Quality and Pollution Control Manager in the audience. Thanked Dr. Rains for attending and the work being accomplished. Mr. Brower reported a septic-to-sewer project in Oakhill is underway. The Living Docks program has deployed oyster mats. Riovation's emerging technology for septic tanks reduces the nutrients in

the septic tank. Stetson University is conducting trials and needs the EPA to issue permits for testing.

Committee on Community Affairs

CS/CS/SB 224 — Citizen Volunteer Advisory Committees

by Rules Committee; Governmental Oversight and Accountability Committee; and Senator Wright

The bill authorizes certain regional citizen volunteer advisory committees to conduct public meetings and workshops by means of communications media technology, as permitted by the Administrative Procedures Act. This authorization applies to volunteer citizen advisory committees created to provide technical expertise and support to the National Estuary Program whose membership is composed of representatives from four or more counties.

The National Estuary Program is a non-regulatory program, administered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, to identify Estuaries of National Significance and support the development of comprehensive management plans to assure such estuaries maintain their ecological integrity. There are currently four recognized National Estuary Programs in Florida:

- Coastal and Heartland National Estuary Program.
- Indian River Lagoon National Estuary Program.
- Sarasota National Estuary Program.
- Tampa Bay National Estuary Program.

Each National Estuary Program is governed by a body known as a National Estuary Program management conference, which may appoint advisory committees to advise the conference on various topics such as research, restoration, technical expertise, public involvement, and resource management. Some management conferences have entered into partnerships with special districts through interlocal agreements to serve as the advisory committee. Meetings of these advisory committees are open to the public.

Communications media technology is defined in law as the electronic transmission of printed matter, audio, full-motion video, freeze-frame video, compressed video, and digital video by any method available. The bill requires that the use of communications media technology at an advisory committee meeting or workshop must allow for all persons attending to audibly communicate as if the person is physically present. Additionally, the notice of the meeting or workshop must state whether communications media technology will be used and how an interested person may participate. An advisory committee member who participates in a meeting or workshop by means of communications media technology is deemed to be present at such meeting or workshop.

If approved by the Governor, or allowed to become law without the Governor's signature, these provisions take effect upon becoming law.
